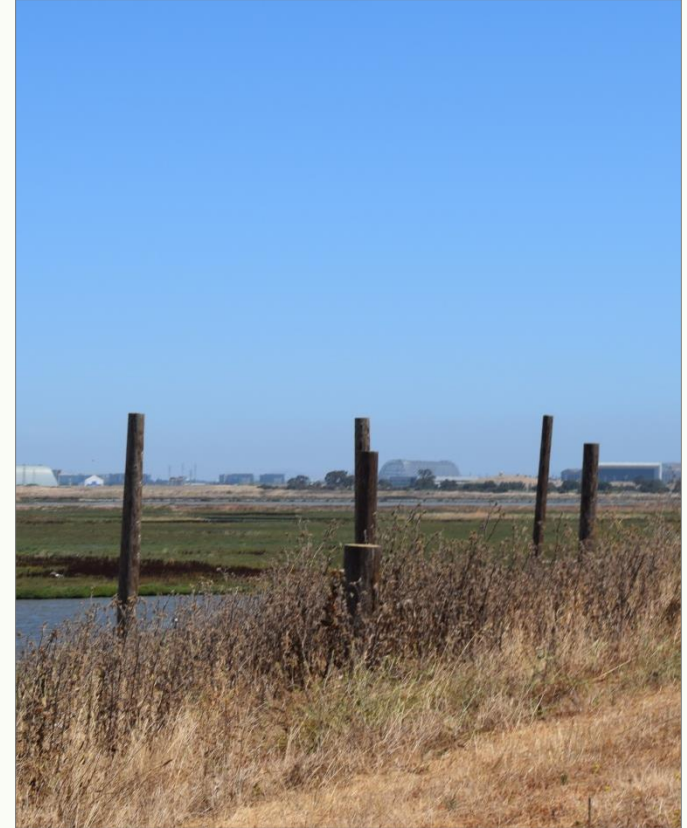

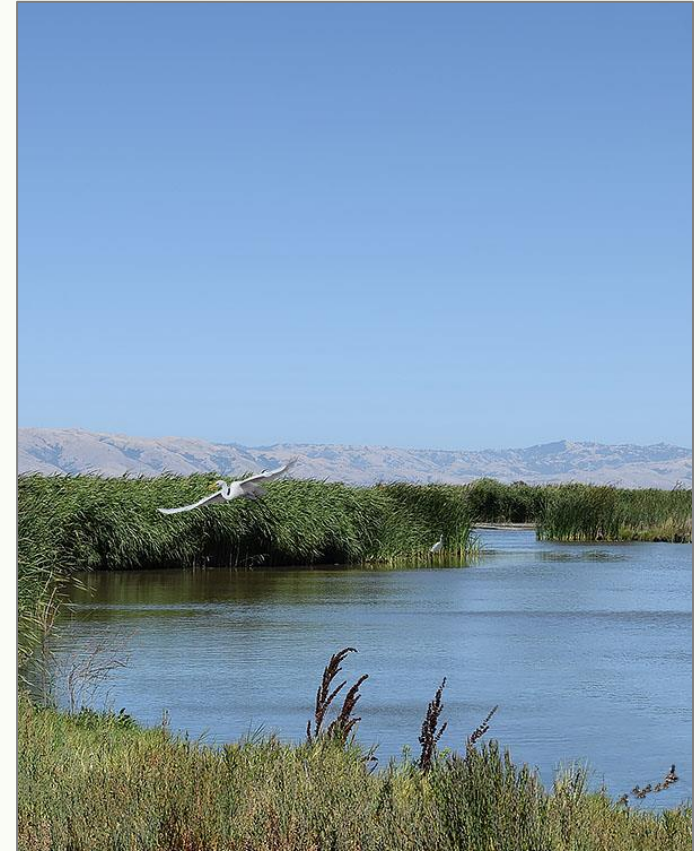

BCCP Overview

- What is it?
 - A comprehensive plan for holistically managing the City of Palo Alto's 1,976.5 acre Baylands Preserve for the next 15 years and beyond
 - An ecosystem-based approach that strives to balance resource protection, environmental education, and recreational use
 - Takes future projects and current trends such as sea level rise and climate change into account
 - Includes site-specific aspects for the former ITT property and Byxbee Park



BCCP Overview (cont'd)

- Planning Process
 - 18 month process (June 2017 to December 2018)
 - Incorporation of 2008 Baylands Master Plan Update
 - New trends/projects/data
 - Stakeholder outreach and engagement
 - 12 distinct tasks

 - Documented Existing Conditions
 - Developed Stakeholder Engagement Plan
