We noticed numbered trail markers on the (I think) Toyon Trail. Is there a publication that describes what you see at each stop?

You are correct, yes the trail markers are on Toyon Trail and there is a pamphlet describing the stops. The Toyon Nature Trail brochure is available at either trail head (near stop 1 on the end nearest the entrance station and near the bridge across the creek in Wildhorse Valley) in boxes mounted on a short post. If you ever find one of the brochure boxes empty, please tell anyone on staff and we will be happy to refill it. You may also get brochures from staff at the entrance station or at the interpretive center.

The stops along the Toyon Nature Trail cover primarily plants and discuss every thing from Poison Oak to the trails namesake the Toyon or Christmas Berry.

Please be certain to visit the nature trail at different times of the year. The winter trail is much different from the spring time trail or the summer and fall trails.
