MOTION: Board Member Lew moved, seconded by Board Member Kim, to approve the Minutes of April 2 and 16, May 7 and 21, and June 4, 2015 as presented.

MOTION PASSED: 3-0 Furth abstaining, Popp absent Vote: 3-0-1-1

Ms. French advised that the July 2, 2015 meeting had only one item on the agenda, the ARB Design Awards. She hoped to provide materials prior to the meeting.

STUDY SESSIONS

1. Downtown Palo Alto Parking Wayfinding: Request by City of Palo Alto Planning and Community Environment for Study Session to present initial design process and concepts for the Downtown Palo Alto Parking Wayfinding project. No action to be taken on this project; discussion only.

Sue Ellen Atkinson reported on the Council's parking management strategies, particularly parking wayfinding. Wayne Hunt, Hunt Design, reviewed existing conditions, types of signs, branding, use of parking counts and design options.

Judith Wasserman, Stakeholder Committee Representative, approved the work of the design team and preferred Option 1 in dark green.

Board Members remarked regarding preferences for design options; replacement of the Parking sign with three directional arrows; alphanumeric names for garages and lots; whether signs could include parking pricing; use of color zones; colors for signs; and design of signs for subterranean garages.

2. **180 El Camino Real [15PLN-00085]:** Request by Eric Allen of SPG Center, LLC, on behalf of the Board of Trustees to the Leland Stanford Junior University, for a Study Session on proposed tenant façade improvements and site improvements, such as tree removal, landscaping, lighting, paving, and new freestanding and directional signage visible from the public right of way for the Stanford Shopping Center. No action to be taken on this project; discussion only.

Rebecca Atkinson reviewed project components, constraints, signage and light poles. No public comment had been received.

Mark Kelly, BAR Architects, provided an overview of the project and its elements. Gaylon Melton, Simon Property Group, discussed proposed signage. Gary Laymon, The Guzzardo Partnership, reported on proposed landscaping for the project.

Board Members and Staff discussed the Sign Code and the sign program for Stanford with respect to flashing signs. Board Members commented on bike traffic within the shopping center; backless benches; signage and lighting; and visibility of vehicular signage.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Formal Reviews

3. 4200 El Camino Real [14PLN-00492]: Request by America's Tire Co., on behalf of Wells Fargo N.A. Trustee, for Architectural Review and Conditional Use Permit for facade renovation, site improvements, landscaping and signage for an automotive service use. Environmental Assessment: Exempt from the provision of CEQA per Section 15301 (Existing Facilities). Zoning District: CS (Service Commercial).

Jodie Gerhardt reviewed details required by the design guidelines and details of the project. The project conformed with parking standards by providing 20 spaces. Proposed signage conformed to requirements of the Sign Code and the El Camino Guidelines.

Board Member Furth visited the site and contacted the Planner to ask questions.

Don Thrailkill, America's Tire Company, proposed major renovations to an older building that needed upgrades.

Board Members remarked regarding tinted glazing; screening of mechanical equipment; monument signs; sidewalk width and landscape elements; potential noise problems; the cornice and entryway; the gateway at the corner; and bicycle parking.

MOTION: Board Member Lew moved, seconded by Board Member Kim, to continue the project to August 6, 2015.

MOTION PASSED: 4-0-1-0

Board Member Furth indicated the main issues were the monument sign, useable landscape space, the sound study, and widening the sidewalk.
