

For those interested in a more hands-on approach to school safety, PAUSD will soon be looking for volunteers in a new community-oriented safety program. Unlike PAUSD's pre-pandemic School Safety Committee, we are now looking at a more site-specific approach for stronger support in each school community. Much like the original Safety Committee concept, PAUSD Safety teams are to include district and site admin, certificated and classified staff, parents, and secondary students. The new approach will include training, bi-weekly site meetings, monthly Districtwide meetings, and team leads to offer support at each site. 
School Fencing: Benefits and Disadvantages [LINK]
