ATTACHMENTS

Rabies Certificate. Must be submitted with this application. A valid certificate includes: date vaccine was given, expiration date, manufacturer, and vaccine serial number. Receipts without this information will not be accepted.

Spay/Neuter Certificate. If you are submitting a new application (not a renewal) and your dog is altered, you must submit a spay/neuter certificate to receive the altered dog discount.

WHY LICENSE?

It's the law.

California law and city ordinances require all dogs over the age of four months to be vaccinated and licensed. If you are cited for owning an unlicensed dog, you could face fines of \$50-150 per dog. Also, if your pet becomes lost, a license tag on your pet's collar is the fastest way to reunite you and your pet. Even if a pet has a microchip, a license tag is immediately visible and does not require a scanner.

It ensures rabies control.

In countries without rabies control, many people die each year from contracting this disease. Rabies is almost always fatal. Every state mandates their counties and cities to protect their citizens from contracting rabies by mandating that all owned dogs (and sometimes cats) be given a rabies vaccine. Cities require residents to license their pets so they may obtain a record of the proof of vaccination.

A rabies tag, which may be provided by your veterinarian, is separate from a license tag. The issuer of the rabies tag cannot license your pet.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Rabies Exemption

If your veterinarian has determined that receiving the rabies vaccine is a health hazard for your dog, you may file for an **exemption form** the rabies vaccine under State of California H&S Code 121690 to still obtain a dog license, which is still required by law. Change/Cancel License

Please notify us if you are moving out of town, if your dog passes away or is re-homed so you do not continue to receive renewal notices and potential citations.

Cat Registration

Cat licenses are not required in Palo Alto, Los Altos or Los Altos Hills.
